The School District

Stanfield School District serves the students of the Stanfield School District with a comprehensive K-12 program. Currently 520 students are served by a staff of 60, including 30 teachers. The district completed a new elementary school in January 2001. The secondary school consists of a shared campus for grades 7-12. The district operates its own food service program and contracts its transportation system.

A favorable student/teacher ratio encourages individual attention to meet student needs. Umatilla County ESD provides special education programs, migrant/bilingual programs and instructional support in media, curriculum, and vocational education.

The District encourages academic and co-curricular excellence. The District takes pride in the large number of students that participate in athletic and music programs.

The District is administered by a superintendent/elementary principal and a secondary principal and is governed by a five-member elected Board of Directors. The District operates with a current tax base which currently supports a General Fund operational budget of 5 million.

Our campus was completed by the addition of a track and field complex located between the elementary and secondary buildings. The new track is utilized a great deal by our athletic teams, physical education classes, and has become a focal point of community use.



The Community

Stanfield is located along Oregon Hwy 395, 24-miles west of Pendleton and 5 miles south of Hermiston. Tri-Cities, Washington, a major shopping area, is 40 miles to the north. The population of the city of Stanfield is 2,200, with another 17,000 people living in the Hermiston area. The schools are a focal point of this friendly Eastern Oregon community.

The area's fertile soil and moderate climate make it an ideal place for a variety of agricultural products including cattle, wheat, potatoes, corn, hay, and other crops. These products support several food processing plants. Some major employers of the area are Wal-Mart Distribution Center, and Union Pacific Railroad. The growing economy is a draw to many new businesses. In addition, hospital and medical offices are available in nearby Hermiston, Pendleton and Tri-Cities, WA. Higher education is readily available through Blue Mountain Community College and Eastern Oregon University.

Hunting and fishing abound in this rural area. Winter sports include skiing and snowmobiling. Summer sports and activities include swimming, golf, boating, and tennis. The area hosts the annual Farm City Pro Rodeo and Umatilla County Fair in August.
